Because He Lives

As we approach the celebration of Resurrection Sunday, many may be wondering, "What do we have to celebrate?" After all, we have had to deal with a pandemic that has claimed many lives and separated us from the normal interaction with friends and relatives. We are affected by the mass shootings in Georgia and Colorado. We have witnessed the rise of hatred and division in our country and community. So, then why do we or perhaps why should we celebrate this Resurrection season?

The simple answer is "Because He Lives."

Because He lives, you and I have Peace. When Jesus appeared to His disciples that first Resurrection Sunday, the first words out of His mouth were "Peace be with you!" (John 20:19). The peace that Jesus spoke of was more than just a sense of calmness or tranquility. It was the Hebrew word "shalom" and it was pregnant with meaning. It meant wholeness, completeness, serenity, and harmony of life. At the very center of this peace is peace with God, reconciliation with the One who breathed life into the universe.

Because He lives, I have a Purpose. The next words that Jesus uttered to His disciples were: "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you" (John 20:21). Where was He sending them? Everywhere. In other words, they were going to become ambassadors of Christ. Their mission, and ours, should we choose to accept it, was and is to spread the word about the cross and the empty tomb – to share the message of Jesus with friends, neighbors, and relatives. We are to use our love, lives, and lips to testify about the power of the cross and the promise of eternal life.

Because He lives, I have a Promise. At the end of this encounter with the risen Christ, John tells us, "these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name (John 20:31 NIV).

That's the promise of John 3:16, too. All throughout His ministry, Jesus promised life everlasting to those who believe in Him. The promise of eternity is the heartbeat of hope. And the resurrection of Jesus insures that we too will be resurrected.

Resurrection Sunday is the cornerstone of the Christian faith; the celebration of Jesus rising from the grave conquering death and giving us peace with God, a purpose for life and the promise of heaven.

That's what this day is all about: to share our peace, purpose and promise with others who are desperately searching for meaning in the midst of a chaotic world.

Vision Statement:


To build a community where all member churches work together in harmony in service to God by helping those in need.
