## More Than a Babe in a Manger



*“For there is born to you this day in the City of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.”*

Somehow in a season we are meant to savor, we spend our energy trying to accomplish every activity in our overcommitted schedules. All the busyness and stress of parties, gifts, and traditions often leave us wondering, “Why do we do all of this?” Reflecting on how we use our time and why is certainly a valuable exercise, but there is a more pointed question for this Christmas season that will bring increasing joy and peace to our hearts the more we dwell on its wondrous answer: Who is this Jesus? The answer to this question is the best gift we will ever receive, and it has the power to change not just Christmas but every day of the year.

The arrival on God in the flesh was a surprisingly quiet affair. You would think that the incarnation of the divine would be an explosive, earth shattering event. However, except for Joseph and Mary and a few others, no one knew that the time had come when God would send His Son into the world to save it. Bethlehem was crowded, not because people were expecting the Messiah but because Caesar Augustus had decreed everyone must travel to their ancestral home to be registered for the census. The only visitors the King of kings received as He was cradled in a manger that first night were scraggly shepherds who had heard the news of his birth from angels.

Despite appearances, Jesus’ coming was hardly unscheduled – His was an arrival promised and planned since the beginning (Genesis 3:15). Throughout the Old Testament, God continuously reminded His people that His Anointed One would come and save them from the curse of sin and death. His Son would reign and rule over all the nations of the earth forever. In particular, the Psalms contain many passages that prophesy about the Messiah – passages that the New Testament reveals are fulfilled in Jesus.

This Christmas, I encourage all of us to take time to reflect on the babe born in Bethlehem who now reigns as King of kings and Lord of lords.
